- Communion—At St. John we practice <u>membership communion</u>. That means we invite to the altar those who have expressed their agreement with the biblical teachings of this church through <u>current</u> membership here at St. John or other WELS or ELS congregations. Any visitor desiring communion needs to speak to pastor before worship. Communion will be distributed at the communion rail. If you require communion in the pew, please speak with pastor or one of the ushers before worship.

Resurrection REALity

If Christ remained dead, then the grave is the final, ugly, rotten end of us all. But Christ has indeed been raised. So, Jesus' resurrection proves that "all will be made alive" (1 Corinthians 15:22). The reality of the resurrection does not just change our future, but also the way we look at life now. The a great theologian of long ago, Augustine, called the season of Easter "a joyful week of weeks"— seven wonderful weeks, each seven glorious days long. In this glorious season, let us meditate upon the breath-taking implications of the resurrection.

THEME OF THE DAY: Resurrection REALity: The Risen Savior Provides Good Shepherding

Scripture frequently pictures spiritual care in terms of a shepherd watching over sheep. Even folks unfamiliar with shepherding are able to grasp the meaning. Jesus goes over and above ordinary shepherds. He laid down his life for his sheep. His care is real! The word "pastor" comes from the Latin word for "shepherd." Today, there are plenty of people —pastors, religious leaders, etc.—who claim they provide healing for your soul. Yet, Scripture warns that "many" of these are "false prophets" (1 John 4:1) who "distort the truth" (Acts 20:30). Many! The resurrection reality, however, is that our Good Shepherd is faithful. He has given his Word which identifies faithful sub-shepherds of Christ, and is faithfully used by them.

Dear friends, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see if they are from God, for many false prophets have gone out into the world. ² This is how you can recognize the Spirit of God: Every spirit who confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God. ³ and every spirit who does not confess Jesus is not from God. This is the spirit of the Antichrist, which you have heard is coming and is already in the world. ⁴ You are from God, dear children, and you

have overcome the false prophets, because the one in you is greater than the one in the world. 5 They are from the world. That is why they speak from a worldly perspective and the world listens to them. 6 We are from God. The one who knows God listens to us, but whoever is not from God does not listen to us. That is how we can distinguish between the spirit of truth and the spirit of error.
